- SUS Principles – Doctrinaire/Ideological (Universality/Integrity and equity) and organizational-hierarchical principles and regionalization (deconcentrating)
- Public Health Politics
- Regulating Agencies on Health
- Health-Disease Binomial and the levels of health attention: primary, secondary and tertiary.
- Life habits and Chronical Non-transmissible Diseases (LCND)
- Transmissible Diseases: prevention and control
- Physical and mental health on the life cycle
- Introduction to Epidemiology: Indicators of Health and Disease Measures (morbidity, mortality, lethality, and association measures)
- Design of experimental and observational studies: clinical trial, transversal, ecological, case-control, cohort

Methodology

Expositive dialogue classes in foreign language (English)

Study of clinical cases, in the diverse levels of attention to health.

Presentation of Seminars contextualizing Public Health situations, with diseases in evidence: for example: Monkeypox, Covid-19, yellow-fever, measles.

Discussion groups in front of the exhibition of videos about the SUS

External visits: SES (State Department of Health), Private Tertiary Hospital (HSL), University Hospital of High Complexity (Incor)
