Mackenzie International Week

Mackenzie Presbyterian University (MPU) held the 2nd International Week from September 19 to 23. The event offered the opportunity for students and professors of all levels (undergraduate and graduate) to learn about internationalization opportunities at the university. Various activities were offered, including lectures with partner institutions, panels to present works in collaboration with foreign professors, as well as international research.

The Mackenzie Center for Radio Astronomy and Astrophysics (CRAAM), at Mackenzie Presbyterian University (MPU), developed the solar telescope for the mid infrared, called HATS, a world pioneer to observe the solar activity in this spectral band.

Mackenzie's Professor is the winner of the Ester Sabino Award

Professor Maria Helena Moura Neves, from the Postgraduate Program in Letters (PPGL) of Mackenzie Presbiterian University, is the winner of the Ester Sabino Award in the Senior Researcher category, with 52 .6% of votes. The ceremony took place on February 11, the date on which the International Day of Women and Girls in Science is celebrated. The award is given to women scientists who contribute to scientific development in the state of São Paulo and is granted by the Government of the State of São Paulo.

CAPES Print Program 3rd International Multi-project Symposium

Mackenzie Presbyterian University (MPU) held the 3rd International Multi-project Symposium from the CAPES PrInt Program from September 27th to 30th for students and professors of all levels (undergraduate and graduate), to showcase all the results achieved during the implementation of the project.

The CAPES PrInt is an Institutional Internationalization Plan that is implemented on 36 Brazilian universities including Mackenzie Presbyterian University, with a granted fund of 10 million Reais, which aims to improve the university's internationalization in multiple levels, ranging from collaborative research projects with foreign entities to academic mobility of both students and professors. Provost of Research and Graduate Programs, Professor Felipe Chiarello highlighted the importance of internationalization and research saying how his teachers changed his life when they offered him an opportunity to go to Harvard and the New York University.
